**DISCLAIMER**

The following lists of emergency drugs for different levels of sedation is a guideline for the practitioner to follow. The WV Board of Dentistry authorizes alternative medications that are appropriate substitutes.

**All Dental Offices**

Oxygen Portable tank with appropriate masks or nasal prongs  
Aspirin 325mgs (Chewable)  
Diphenhydramine 50mg/ml vial injectable  
Albuteral Inhaler  
Ammonia Capsules  
Epi-pen (Auto injectors) (adult and child) / Epi Ampoules Inject  
Nitroglycerine tablets/or spray  
Insta-glucose  
Diazepam 5mg/ml vial injectable **(Recommended)**  
CPR Breathing mask / Ambu Bag / Mask & positive pressure bag  
Blood Pressure Cuff  
Stethoscope  
Thermometer  
AED - Automated External Difibrillator **(Highly recommended)**  
Nasal Naloxone **(Highly Recommended)** - Free From Local Health Departments

**Class 2 Anesthesia Permit**

Oxygen  
Aspirin 325mgs (Chewable)  
Diphenhydramine 50mg/ml vial injectable  
Albuterol Inhaler  
Ammonia Capsule  
Epi-pen(Auto-injector) (adult and child) / Epi Ampoules Inject  
Nitroglycerine tablets / spray  
Insta-glucose  
Diazepam 5mg/ml vial injectable  
Flumazenil injectable  
Naloxone **\*\*Note patients who take narcotics are subject to a deeper level of sedation.**  
AED - Automated External Defibrillator  
CPR Breathing Mask  
Blood Pressure Cuff  
Stethoscope  
Thermometer  
Pulse Oximeter **\*REQUIRED\***

### **Class 3A and B and Class 4**

Oxygen portable  
Aspirin 325mg (Chewable)  
Diphenhydramine 50mgs/ml vial injectable  
Albuterol Inhaler  
Ammonia Capsule  
Epi-pen auto injector (adult and child) or alternative ampoules Epinephrine (see below)  
Morphine or Fentanyl - Demerol alternative  
Nitroglycerine tablets or spray  
Insta-glucose  
Flumazenil injectable  
Naloxone - injectable or nasal spray  
Epi ampoules 1:10,000 and 1:1,000  
Atropine injectable  
D50 -----> Glucagon alternative or other compound  
Midazolam (Versed) - Injectable  
Diazepam (Valium) - Injectable  
Adenosine -----> other B-blocker alternatives  
Amiodarone -----> Lidocaine alternative  
Succinylcholine (refrig or powder)  
Ephedrine -----> Phenylephrine injectable IV  
Labetolol or equivalent such as Esmolol  
Solu-cortef -----> Decadron alternative  
Ondansetron (Zofran) -----> Phenergan alternative

### **Class 4 with Sevofluorane**

Dantrolene 6 Vials in office - or the building if hospital  
Temperature Monitors (**Recommended**)

### **Class 3A and B and Class 4**

AED - Automated External Defibrillator  
Blood Pressure Monitor  
Pulse Oximeter  
EKG Monitor  
Pre-Cordial Stethoscope -----> Required per Academy of Pediatric Anesthesia & AAOMS  
CO2 Monitor (Capnography/end-tidal CO2)  
Thermometer  
Glucometer
